

Sunday Reflection:

Today we celebrate the Feast of Saint Peter and Saint Paul, the two giants of our Christian faith. What is beautiful about this feast, is that we celebrate them together, yet they were two very different characters. In their distinct differences and uniqueness, we celebrate their joint mammoth efforts in shaping the early church and transmitting the faith to us. They were different, yet they were one! Yes, they were very different:

- Peter was from Galilee, in modern-day Israel. Paul was from Tarsus, in modern-day Turkey.
- Peter was a disciple of Jesus and knew Jesus personally. Paul had been a zealous Jew who persecuted Christians, before experiencing a dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus, but didn't physically spend time with Jesus.
- Peter was a fisherman by trade, while Paul was a tentmaker.

Even though Peter and Paul were very different and held differing views, they were ONE. United in their efforts, united in their love for Christ.

And it is something that unfortunately we often forget in our church today, where there can be so much internal infighting. Differences of opinions, yes, but we have to remember we must remain as one and show a united front.

Unity and Communion are at the center of today's feast! Both Peter and Paul were unyielding in their proclamation of the Gospel, regardless of the opposition they faced. They FEARLESSLY shared the message of salvation, even when it was met with resistance or persecution.
